WATCHING TV IN YOUR ROOM

Like watching TV? Most of us do. You need to be covered by a TV Licence to watch or record live TV programmes on any channel, or to download or watch BBC programmes on BBC iPlayer. And that goes for watching via your mobile, tablet or computer, as well as on a TV.





GETTING A TV LICENCE IS EASY

A TV Licence costs £169.50.

You can pay in one go or spread the cost by setting up a Direct Debit.

Have your bank or card details ready.

ANY QUESTIONS?

I have a TV Licence for my home and I'm only on base part time. Do I need another licence?

Probably. You'll need a second licence to watch or record live TV programmes on any channel, or to download or watch BBC programmes on BBC iPlayer, when you are on base.

However, you don't need a second licence to watch BBC programmes on BBC iPlayer which you've previously downloaded at home.

Also, if you only ever use a device that is not plugged into the mains and powered solely by its own batteries, you will still be covered in your room by your home TV Licence.

I am in a shared room. Do I need my own licence?

One licence per room is fine. So you can share the costs if you want to.

I'm getting posted somewhere else in the UK. Am I still covered?

You're only covered at the address on your TV Licence. But don't panic. You can update the address to the new one when you move. Go to **tvlicensing.co.uk/update**

I'm getting posted overseas. Can I get a refund on my licence?

If you're leaving the country you can cancel your TV Licence and apply for a refund. Go to **tvlicensing.co.uk/refund**

DON'T RISK AFINE

A TV Licence isn't included in your monthly food and accommodation charges. So it's down to you to buy one should you need it.

If you're found to be breaking the law, you risk prosecution*, a fine of up to £1,000 plus any legal costs and/or compensation you may be ordered to pay.

Wherever you're based, don't risk a fine. Check if you need a TV Licence at: tvlicensing.co.uk/armedforces

*In Scotland, Scottish criminal law applies. A report will be sent to the Procurator Fiscal, who will decide on prosecution.
